1. The Importance of Compassion for People

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 1 Corinthians 13:1

- Caring for others is more important than talent
 - The futility of a loveless life
 - word picture of a sounding gong
- Compassion is more important than intelligence

[&]quot;If I can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, ...but have not love, I am nothing."

We know that we all possess knowledge. Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up.

1 Corinthians 8:1

Compassion is more important than faith

"If I have faith that can move mountains, but I have not love I am nothing."

"if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there' and it will move." Matthew 17:20

"The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love." Galatians 5:6

Compassion is more important than generosity

"If I give all I possess to the poor, but have not love I gain nothing."

Compassion is more important than accomplishment

"If I surrender my body to the flames, but have not love I gain nothing."

Relationships matter more than accomplishments

Each of you should look not only to your own interest, but also to the interest of others. **Philippians 2:4**

By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another. **John 13:35**

4. Cultivate Compassion for People at Work

Speak the truth in love—Ephesians 4:15

Be armed with the sword of the Spirit—Ephesians 6:17

We are to have our feet fitted with the readiness that come from the gospel of peace —**Ephesians 6:15**
